Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

In September we had the privilege of laboring in churches in South Dakota, Wyoming, and Idaho. The month also involved a major change in the equipment that we use to travel the country and serve the Lord. As the month closed out, we enjoyed a great revival meeting in Idaho.

Our first stop was at Elk Point Baptist Church in Elk Point, SD, with Pastor Jesse Hailey. The Hailey family have been dear friends for several years. The church that they started in Pierre was the first place that I preached in South Dakota back in 2007. They have been in Elk Point now for five years. I had the privilege of teaching Sunday School and preaching the Sunday and Wednesday services. While there, Tamatha spoke at their Ladies' Meeting on Thursday. The children enjoyed playing with the Hailey children, and we celebrated Labor Day with a church picnic and had great fellowship throughout the week. We had a wonderful time with the Hailey's and the people of Elk Point.

From Elk Point, we traveled across South Dakota into Wyoming to see the Jeff Vollmer family. Bro. Vollmer pastored in Pierre for four years before being transferred by his job to Wyoming. We stopped over last year to see them. Pastor Clayton Maynard of Landmark Baptist Church in Sheridan, where the Vollmer's attend, invited me to preach on Sunday while we were there. It was a privilege to do so. We had passed through Wyoming over the last several years, but this was my first time to preach in the state. The services were great on Sunday and Wednesday. While there, the Vollmer's said that they were going to support us monthly, and Bro. Maynard invited me to preach next year when we come through. The Lord blessed us with a great time in Wyoming.

Upon leaving Wyoming, we headed to Blackfoot, ID. We would stay at Ebenezer Baptist Church with the Joshua Sykes family for two weeks. The first week we spent canvassing. Bro. Sykes had ordered 2,500 invitation cards to Friend Sunday and the revival meeting, so we had a lot to do. Between the Sykes family, our family, and some church people, we were able to get all of the cards out. Bro. Sykes did have to retrieve some of the cards when the owner of an apartment complex complained about them. We prayed for some visitors to come on Friend Sunday and the Lord answered our prayer. One lady came with her children and father in law. Her brother also came. After we left, she came back one Sunday morning with her husband. The entire family needs to be saved. Please pray for the McBride family. Her brother's name is Carlos. I talked with him between Sunday School and church. He is very confused about what

is truth and what is error. He attends church, but it is not a Bible preaching church. Pray for his salvation.

Another young man came Sunday morning and Tuesday night during the revival. His name is Nathan. I talked to him between Sunday School and church. He too is confused about what is truth and also talked about how his life is messed up. He is from Tucson, AZ, and ended up moving back there in early October. He wanted to stay in touch with me and did ask for a church in Tucson. I gave him the name of a good church there. Pray that Nathan will be saved and become faithful in church.

One other visitor came. Her name is Grace. Her mother faithfully attends Ebenezer, but Grace needs to be saved. Bro. Sykes said that he had witnessed to Grace a couple of years ago, and she seemed near to salvation, but never believed. Please pray for her conversion.

The Lord gave us a wonderful time in Idaho. The children enjoyed playing with the Sykes children, and we enjoyed laboring in the canvassing and revival meeting. The fellowship was great throughout the two weeks as well. We are very thankful for the privilege of laboring in Blackfoot, ID.

On the way to Idaho from Wyoming, the truck started sounding unusual. I took it to the shop in Blackfoot and the news was not good. To put it in common vernacular, we had a blown engine. We bought this particular truck in 2013 in anticipation of buying a bigger trailer. We went with a used truck to save money, but we did not save any money. From November 2013 to September 2015, the truck was in the shop numerous times. We spent over \$10,000 on repairs and now the engine was shot. While we could have had the engine replaced, we felt it best to get rid of the truck. Besides, no bank would loan us money to replace the engine. While in Blackfoot, we bought a new truck.

Because our income is so low, we needed help to get the loan. We used our October support for the down payment. We put a notice on Facebook and several individuals and churches sent immediate offerings to replace the October support and provide help in making the first few payments. Our desire was not to have a nice truck. Our desire was to have reliable equipment to travel the country serving the Lord through preaching the Gospel and encouraging God's people. We are so thankful for each one that helped us in this crisis. For some a vehicle is not a big deal. For us it is our life. We spend much of our time in the truck going from church to church. We appreciate all who have and those who will help us pay for this vehicle.

But the truck problem is not all that we encountered since our last letter. After leaving Idaho, we headed to Utah. While there, the bottom of our slide-out fell in. We were able to get a temporary fix, but the repairman recommended that the problem be permanently repaired ASAP. Because the trailer would be in the shop at least two weeks and probably longer, we canceled our meetings in Arizona. We headed to Alabama to stay in the prophet's chamber at Victory Baptist Church in Cullman, AL. We have several meetings close to Cullman for several weeks. This will allow us to keep all of the November meetings. As I write this, we are still waiting for an estimate on the slide-out. We are expecting something between \$5,000 and \$10,000. We do not have the money, so we are trusting the Lord to provide the money to repair our home.
