Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

February turned out a little different than we planned. We dropped our trailer at the repair shop thinking that it would take a few weeks, but certainly by the end of February, we would have it back. Little did we know that it would be March before we would get the trailer back, and the repair shop could not fix the main problem. I will explain the situation as concisely as possible.

Last August, a crack developed on the outside passenger side of the trailer. To find the cause of the problem they took off the front end of the trailer. When they did, they noticed that the frame of the trailer was cracked. This problem could only be fixed by the manufacturer. We waited several days to find out when the manufacturer could repair the frame. They finally told us that they could fix it in September. Of course, this would not work for us. We have too much to do and cannot do it without a trailer which would not be completely repaired until October. While waiting to hear from the manufacturer, we went to see if it would be possible to trade our current trailer in for another one. We found one that would work for our family. The dealer is willing to take our old trailer as a trade-in and work with us to help us get the new trailer. However, we need help to get the new trailer. We recently sent a detailed letter to several churches letting them know about our situation. We are praying that we can raise \$10,000. This would be enough money to make a good down payment on the trailer. It seems to us to be an insurmountable amount to raise in a short amount of time—the end of March. But we know that the Lord has called us into this ministry of laboring with church planters and pastors of small churches, and we have no other desire than to be in God's will. Our first tent revival is in April. We need a week to move into the trailer, so we are praying that enough will come in and we can purchase the trailer at the end of March and have the first week of April to move into it.

We did not expect to need a new trailer after just three years, but we have traveled over 50,000 miles in the three years that we have had it. Not all of that is pulling the trailer, but a good deal of it is. We have been as far west as Idaho every year, and two years we went to Arizona. Most travel trailers are not made for that much travel. But we are thankful for every place that the Lord has allowed us to serve Him. We would not want to be doing anything else. We need a trailer for our entire family to serve the Lord. We are anxiously awaiting His miraculous provision. He is able, for we serve a great God.

While staying in Shelby, NC, at the Morning Star Baptist Church mission house, we have visited several churches both in North Carolina and South Carolina. We found that some independent Baptist churches are not what we expect in independent Baptist
