Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

This issue of The Old-Time Evangelistic News completes twelve years. I started mailing this out even before we went on the road full-time. In June 2004, I completed the first issue and mailed it to a few people that I thought would be interested in receiving it. For over two years I worked a job, but took some time off to work with church planters—two weeks one year and five weeks another, then went back to work. All that time I sent out this monthly NewsLetter. At first, it was just in letter format with a complete sermon summarized in just a few paragraphs. I would mention a few details about our ministry and family. When we went out full-time, there were more places to mention where we had labored. Later, I changed the sermon portion into the booklet form like it is now and spent several months developing the sermon. I also added the prayer letter portion as it is here. I have enjoyed writing these messages each month and several have mentioned how blessed they have been to receive them. I hope many others of you are blessed to receive them as well.

One issue per month for twelve years means that this is the 144th time that The Old-Time Evangelistic News has been mailed out. Why “Old-Time”? Because that is what I want to identify with—the “old-time” way of the men of the Bible, and more current men such as Bob Jones Sr., Harold Sightler, Oliver Greene, and many others that I could name but will not to conserve space. I repudiate the new way of so-called preaching, the new way of music, the new way of conducting church services, and the new way of living exactly as the world does. I will continue, by the grace of God, to follow the old-time way of preaching, singing, conducting church services, and holy living. It is my duty to preach the Word—God will take care of the results.

1. After the long delay because of our trailer situation, we finally had our first meeting of the year. This was our fourth tent revival with the Grantham family and Faith Independent Baptist Church in Smiths Station, AL. Due to rainy weather and lack of time because we were still doing school, we were only able to distribute 500 of the 1000 invitations that we had ordered. Still, we had a great meeting. As is our custom in the tent revivals, Bro. Van Billingsley and I alternated preaching each night. Bro. Grantham had asked Bro. Layton Sampson from Montgomery, AL, to come to the meeting to lead the singing and sing specials during the services. It was a great addition to the services. Neighboring churches supported the meeting and added to the crowd. Tamatha and the children sang each night as well. It was a wonderful time. Just being under the tent again was refreshing. We enjoyed an outstanding time with the Grantham's, Bro. Sampson, and all of the people in Smiths Station.

2. Three pastors from Opelika, AL, supported the meeting in Smiths Station throughout the week. They began talking about having a meeting in Opelika next year. We would still do the meeting in Smiths Station and also have the meeting in Opelika. That has been our desire since starting the tent ministry. Please pray that this meeting will come to fruition. We put the tent up as much as we are asked, but there are still plenty of weeks that it could be used but is not. Please pray that the Lord will encourage more pastors and churches to have tent revivals.

Prayer Needs

1) Please pray about our trailer situation. We now have \$3,000 towards the down payment. We need \$2,000 more to reach the minimum of \$5,000. We were hoping for more, so the payments would be less, but the offerings are very slow in coming. From what we were told, it would be best to trade it in before heading across the country, but we need help to do so. We are trusting the Lord to provide; 2) Protection in travel; 3) Provision of monthly financial needs; 4) Power in preaching; 5) Completion of schedule for August and October. We have three weeks open in August while we are in the Midwest and three weeks open in Arizona during October. There are a few other open dates later in the year. Pray that the Lord will put us in the right place at the right time.
