Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

In October we said goodbye to the West for a year, and began making our back east. We took six days and parts of two weeks, but by the middle of the month we were in Virginia. We enjoyed the traveling and seeing some places that we had never seen before, but the greatest blessing was seeing God's people, both in new places and in familiar places. From Arizona, we traveled through New Mexico and the panhandle of Texas to arrive in Oklahoma where we stayed for four days. When we left Oklahoma, we traveled through Arkansas and Tennessee, before we arrived in Virginia. We were able to stay there for three weeks before heading further south.

For most of the year, October looked like a busy month. We had a meeting in Kansas scheduled at an established church. Later we were able to schedule a Sunday with a church planter. This past spring, the pastor of a supporting church called and asked me to preach a Sunday night during their missions month. However, the church in Kansas had to cancel the Sunday to Sunday meeting. Then the church planter needed to cancel. Suddenly a busy month was empty for three Sundays. I began contacting some church planters and pastors of established churches that we knew, but everyone already had things scheduled and it would not work to have us come by. I contacted Pastor Scottie Brown in Virginia. He had an open Sunday and told us to come. I had an old friend, John Heffernan, that was an assistant pastor in Oklahoma. He had been after me to stop by. Since we could not schedule anything, we did. The pastor, Larry Karsies, asked me to preach on Sunday night. God graciously allowed us to fill up two of the three Sundays. I really did not know how we were going to pay our bills for the month with no services in which to preach. I should have known better, but, to be honest, I was doubting that our needs would be met. God provided for our needs through the churches in Oklahoma and Virginia.

We still had some needs to be met, but no place to preach on the last Sunday of October. While still in Virginia, we visited Greendale Chapel in Abingdon. Their sign boldly stated—Fundamental, Independent. The sign identified them as church that I would like to know. I had seen it every year for the last seven years as we traveled by it, but we never had the opportunity to drop in for a service. We did on the last Sunday night of October. The pastor, Jerry Eggers, allowed me to say a few words about our ministry and allowed Tamatha and the children to sing. The music and message were great. After the service, the pastor handed me a check. It was what we needed for the remainder of our expenses for the month.

I thought that over the last seven years, I had learned to live by faith. But, as I mentioned earlier, with the cancellations, I doubted. God proved again that he will take care of us. We have about \$3000 in expenses from our travels this year that we still need to pay. They include fuel expenses, roof repair (things not covered by insurance), and the new tires. I am not sure how we will pay for them, but since God took care of us in October, I know that He will take care of those expenses.

We are thankful to all of our regular supporters. Your faithful support keeps us on the road. This month Richard and Shirley Hughes and Jeffrey Jacques gave special offerings. Larry Lantz and his wife sent a special offering to help pay for the tires. The offerings from the churches were a blessing as well. Thank you to everyone who gave.
