Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

In September, we traveled back to South Dakota and then headed further west to Wyoming and Idaho. We enjoyed great services in each place that we were able to serve.

We returned to South Dakota to fill in for Pastor David Warner and parked our trailer at Glory Bound Baptist Church in Hoven. Since we were parked there, Pastor Brad Ohler asked me to preach on Wednesday, September 3. I was thrilled to do so. We enjoyed a great service and fellowship with the people of Glory Bound.

The next day, September 4, Tamatha flew back to Greenville. Later, I told her that seeing her get on the plane, and then having the plane take off, was probably the most difficult thing that I ever had to do. A few days later, all of her doctors gave her permission to travel, and we began counting down the days to her permanent return.

On Sunday, September 7, I filled in for Pastor David Warner at New Freedom Baptist Church in Selby and Mobridge, SD. It had been several years since we had been to these churches, and it was a great blessing to return and see several familiar faces. We enjoyed preaching at both churches and fellowshiping with the Warner and Wright families.

From South Dakota, we headed to Wyoming. The Jeff Vollmer family had moved to Wyoming from South Dakota earlier this year, and we took a few days to enjoy some good fellowship. While there, we were able to go to and meet the pastor of the church plant that they are helping. The children enjoyed playing with the Vollmer children, and I enjoyed the time with Jeff and Jenny.

On September 19, we left Wyoming and headed for Blackfoot, Idaho. We would stay there for two weeks. The first week we worked on getting out 1,000 invitations to Friend Sunday. That would kick off our revival for the last week of September. The children worked hard, and we were able to get out 500 during the week. On Saturday, September 27, several people from churches about 2 hours away came up from Utah and labored to get out the other 500. In spite of the rain, they were able to finish distributing the remaining 500.

On Friend Sunday, 6 visitors came to the service. One lady came forward during the invitation, and Tamatha was able to talk with her for a long time. She had many problems that Tamatha tried to help her with. Pastor Sykes was able to talk during the fellowship meal to another young couple who had come. The young man gave testimony of salvation, but the young lady did not. Please pray for all three of these. They are in great need of salvation or spiritual growth.

The meeting was well attended during the week. The church people came every night and people from several neighboring churches came as well. We had a fantastic time with the Joshua Sykes family and the people of Ebenezer Baptist Church. The dates are set for the last two weeks of September next year. We are already looking forward to being there again.

Prayer Needs

1) Power in preaching in Arizona and Alabama in October and November; 2) Protection in traveling through Arizona, and then across the country to Alabama the first or second week of November; 3) Provision of needs. I try to mention financial needs as rarely as possible, but recent events seem to necessitate what I am mentioning. The tires on our trailer that we bought last year began to wear out. At the repair shop, the repairman noticed that the trailer suspension was wearing out as well. He said that this contributed to the premature wearing out of the tires. The replacing of the suspension and a new set of 12-ply heavy duty trailer tires cost us nearly \$5000. Of course, we do not have that kind of money on hand, so now we need to pay for it. Combined with the truck tires we had to buy in June, truck repairs last December, and fuel costs, we now need to pay nearly \$10,000. In the past, we have paid off any remaining fuel costs at the first of each year. Because of Tamatha's sickness, we were unable to do that this year. Now these repair bills seem insurmountable. Our goal is to pay this off by March. We plan to spend January-March in the Southeast preaching and presenting the need in as many churches as possible. If you want to help with this need by having us come, then call or e-mail. If the Lord leads you to help by going ahead and sending an offering, we would certainly appreciate it. We began this ministry trusting in the Lord to supply our daily need. We are still depending upon Him. Your help, as led by the Lord, will relieve us of this burden, and enable us to serve Him more effectively next year.
