We began the month by dropping in at River City Baptist Church in Pierre, SD. Pastor Bret Groves had just begun his pastorate at the church a few weeks before we came to town. Bro. Groves was hesitant about having us come because he felt the church could not give us a good offering, but a couple in the church, Bro. and Mrs. Larry Lantz, who also support us, wanted to have us for a meal, so we made our way to Pierre. We enjoyed good Sunday School and Sunday morning messages from Bro. Groves. Sunday afternoon we ate with the Lantzes and, while eating, Bro. Groves sent me a message asking me to preach that night. It was a pleasure to do so, and we enjoyed a good service. Along with the church offering, the Lantzes and another lady gave us offerings.
