Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

After six weeks of waiting, our trailer was finally finished, and we were able to take it to Alabama for our second tent revival of the year. We enjoyed a great time in southeast Alabama before we headed to the north central section of the state to prepare for our third tent revival.

As I have mentioned for the last couple of months, we took our trailer in for some repairs. Some were just minor things that need to be done every so often due to the wear and tear of traveling. One, the back wall in the boys' room, was major. The wall had begun separating from the frame of the trailer. While preparing to fix the wall, the repairmen noticed some cracks in the steel beams where the tires attach to the trailer. I had noticed those cracks, but forgot to mention them when we took the trailer in for the repairs. Thankfully, the men noticed the cracks because if they had gotten worse, the wheels could have fallen off while we were traveling. Repairing the cracks would avert catastrophe.

The repair shop contacted a welder who could do the repair job. After he finished, the shop could repair the wall. After everything was finished, the bill was \$11,000. Needless to say, we were in shock and had no idea how we could pay such a bill. Our insurance would only cover part of the work, \$6,000, so we needed to come up with an additional \$5,000. Tamatha mentioned our predicament on Facebook, and several friends responded immediately with offers of prayer and help. One of them, Jan Stafford, our former pastor's wife, said that she had been blessed and could in turn be a blessing to us. Some of you may remember that her husband, our pastor, died last year after battling melanoma. She met with us and gave us what we needed for the trailer and some extra to help with other needs. Our hearts were humbled and grateful for her kindness to us. We went to pay for the repair work, had a thermostat replaced on our truck, began moving back into our trailer, and headed for Alabama.

We were a week late getting to Alabama, so Bro. Van, the pastor, and some other men already had the tent up. We began the meeting on Tuesday, April 14 and finished on Sunday, April 19. We appreciate the pastors and people from Oakside Baptist in LaGrange, GA; Victory Baptist in Columbus, GA; Marvyn Parkway Baptist and two other churches in Opelika, AL, who attended and supported the meeting. We enjoyed great services each night and, in spite of some bad weather, were able to meet under the tent every night. On Saturday and Sunday nights, three young people (one of them was Nowelle) either were saved or found assurance of their salvation. We praise the Lord
